This **accredited course** provides delegates the skills recognise the signs and symptoms of common mental health issues in children, engage in supportive and non-judgemental conversation and signpost to effective support.

Delegates will gain an in depth understanding of mental health and the factors that can affect wellbeing, as well as practical skills to spot the triggers and signs of mental illness, and the confidence to step in, reassure and support children and their parents in distress.

Upon completion they will receive an MHFA Certificate and accreditation as a Young Person Mental Health First Aider.

Only 16 delegates can attend this course.

There is subsidised cost of £180 per delegate, this includes additional resources which will be sent in the post.

Due to demand for places on this course, non–attendance at this course will incur repayment of full costs of £240.

Governors may wish to attend, to gather ideas.

The 5 Foundations of Effective Attendance Practice framework is modelled on the work of Professor Katherine Weare. The emphasis is on developing a school culture and climate which builds a sense of connectedness and belonging to ensure all children can attend school and thrive. The approach ensures schools prioritise building solid working relationships with children / parents prior to any escalation. The approach allows educational settings to identify triggers early that can lead to poor attendance issues such as mental health issues, lack of trust, communication and relationship breakdowns and the possible lack of networking opportunities both internal (in-school) and external (external agencies).

The Foundations framework has most recently been reviewed by the Department for Education. The Foundations framework received an excellent report following the four-day review.

"The Foundations approach is an excellent example of best practice; there are very clear and detailed systems and procedures in place to manage absence and attendance consistently".

If you are working with children with additional needs, and they are reliant on receiving effective additional provision and support, this training is a must. Understanding SEND law is vital to ensuring your SEND children and families receive all they need to make progress and thrive.

The aim of the session is to promote:

- 1. An understanding of what SEND Myths are and why they are an issue.
- 2. A working understanding of the main aspects of SEND law on funding and EHCP process as it applies in England.
- 3. Confidence and insight to discuss these aspects and challenge LAs/professionals where appropriate.
- 4. The knowledge and references to inform work done by parents/professionals.

Essentially, Garry will share a wealth of knowledge about how SEND law can support schools, parents, children, and families in ascertaining appropriate levels of funding and provisions for the children and young people you work with.



- Always get approval from the person responsible for inset in your school before booking online.
- One-form entry schools get one free place on every course. Two-form entry schools get two free places on every course. Three-form entry schools get three places on every course.
- Additional places can be purchased. £25 for online £40 for face to face.
- Governor CPDF places are £15 each.
- Some courses have additional charges, this is stated in the CPDF plan.
- Failure to attend a pre-booked place will incur a charge. (£40 for a Zoom course and £60 for a Face-to-Face course.)
- Failure to attend residential or cancellation less than 2 weeks before will result in full charge.
- Cancellation of a place must take place 5 working days before session or charge incurred.
- Zoom links will be sent to delegates in advance of CPDF, please do a tech check before the day and contact us if any issues.
- Please ensure your computer has a working camera AND a working microphone
